RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF FISHER PREPARES FOR HIGH WATER

Stay Clear of Work Crews and Flooded Areas

The Rural Municipality of Fisher continues respond to flooding.

Overland flooding has closed several roads in the municipality. Residents are asked to travel only if necessary, drive with care and avoid any area being serviced by road crews.

Drivers are requested to stay away from work areas for everyone's safety. Please do not attempt to check on the situation.

The rapidly changing station means high water and washouts may not have been identified.

Municipal officials and residents are coordinating with provincial officials and neighboring communities.

- The municipality declared a State of Local Emergency on April 21, 2026.
- The following roads closed:
 - Road 3W between 150N and 149N
 - Road 4W between Road 144N and 145N
 - Road 4W between Road 137N and 138N
 - Road 133N between Road 1W and Meridian
 - Road 139N between Road 3W and 4W
 - Road 140N between 4W and 6W
 - Road 145N between 13W and 14W
 - Road 148N between Road 2W and 3W
 - PR 233 between 4W and 6W
- Five tiger dams are currently deployed at five properties at risk.
- Proceed with extreme caution throughout the municipality.
 - Heavy flooding is occurring adjacent to the town of Fisher Branch.
 - There are high water levels near Highway 17 and Highway 233.

- Properties that have historically required tiger dams should clear a minimum of 20 feet of snow and surrounding materials.
- All residents are encouraged to ensure sump pumps are functioning properly; in Fisher Branch, residents are advised to divert weeping tile water away from the sewer system.
- Residents living near the river are advised to move valuables to higher ground and producers should prepare for livestock relocation.
- The RM has made more than 3,000 sandbags, which are available for pickup at the RM Public Works Yard, on weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Residents are encouraged to bring help to load vehicles.
- The RCMP reminds people to stay away waterways.

Residents with questions requiring flood preparation should contact their ward Councillor or municipal office.
