# **Delegates:**

Fisher Fire Department Fire Chief Patrick Davy.

Fire Chief Davy gave Council an update on the Fisher Fire Department. He stated that attendance to fire calls is up and the unit is working well with each other. There are possibly 5 people interested in signing up to be volunteer fire fighters. The new water tanker is working very well and is proving to be a good investment. A full inventory is being taken at the fire hall. Radios are working great and equipment obtained from the flood protection grant is beneficial. There have been 22 fire calls so far in 2020.

Administration to contact Western Financial to see if the fire fighters are covered when responding to areas where no mutual aid exists.

The Fire Chief has stated his intentions for budgeting for equipment for the 1, 3, 5 year financial plan.

Reeve Pyziak to contact Ashern Fire inspector to help out in Fisher region until Fire Chief Davy gets certification in the future.

**AND WHEREAS** the location of these signs is listed in schedule "C" of By-Law 1186/20:

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** The Rural Municipality of Fisher allow Manitoba Infrastructure Traffic Engineering to install signage prohibiting engine retarder brakes at designated locations and at the expense of the Rural Municipality of Fisher.

# 7. Shurka Drain – Tabled

Correspondence has been sent to Mr. Pyziak by the municipality, and 2 meeting requests have been submitted to GPR Project Management. Municipality has not received response from either party. Tabled.

8. Broad Valley Subdivision

Moved by Councillor Gagaluk and seconded by Councillor Nevakshonoff 170/20 **WHEREAS** application has been made to subdivide a 2-acre surplus

farmstead from an 89.5 acre holding in NE ¼ 15-23-2 WPM (CT 3045115/1) for residential purposes with the residential to remain in agriculture;

**AND WHEREAS** the proposal will comply with the Fisher Armstrong Planning District Development Plan;

**AND WHEREAS** the proposal will comply with the RM of Fisher Zoning By-Law by way of the following:

1.) obtained a variance to vary the side yard requirement for the proposed lot from the minimum 50 feet to 18.6 feet for two accessory buildings (shed, metal clad & shed, shingle);

- 2.) revised the property boundaries of the proposed lot to satisfy the side yard requirements per the RM of Fisher Zoning By-law;
- 3.) remove the two accessory buildings from the proposed lot in order to comply with the side yard requirements per the RM of Fisher Zoning By-law.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Council of the Rural Municipality of Fisher hereby approve the application to subdivide the surplus farmstead as long it complies with the above and all municipal and provincial regulatory legislation;

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that all Rural Municipality of Fisher property taxes and outstanding debts are paid in full.

# 9. Road Haul Agreements

Contractor to meet with Ward Councillor to review conditions that will be set in MOU with Councillor. If a grader is required the MOU will state that. If use of private grader, grader must

have liability insurance or can hire Public works for a standard hourly rate to repair road. Council discussed possibility to have 1 blanket MOU for the entire year or spring to fall. Administration to contact neighboring municipalities. Dust control should be an option when using roads at high volumes.

#### 10. Bottle Creek

A request was made to clean out a portion of Bottle Creek. Provincial operations Manager Heinjie Arado for water management and structures has stated in an email to the Chief Administrative Officer that Bottle Creek is planned for clean out in 2024/2025. Only downstream portion of Bottle Creek (which is Provincial authority) can be cleaned out first.

11. Andre Conan – S ½ 27-24-1W Drain Clean Out

Currently Weik Construction is working in Ward 5 and 6 and are doing 10 miles in 11.5 hours and 8 miles in 9.5 hours.

Deputy Reeve Abas would like administration to report how many miles and how many passes are made by municipal public works for the next regular council meeting. Chief Administrative Officer will provide maps from software JD Link to council as well as any work orders that have come in within that 2-week period.

The Deputy Reeve will also like administration to contact David Bardarson for potential training to new operators.
