We ask that you please use caution and slow down when passing our graders as they work. Let's all get home safely.

WINTER ROAD SURVIVAL TIPS



Winter is here and that means those of us who live in rural Manitoba will be

doing their fair share of traveling on our chilly and sometimes hazardous roadways. Here are some tips to help you survive a rural winter road mishap.

IF YOUR VEHICLE IS STUCK IN THE SNOW

- Try to stay calm and don't go out in the cold. Staying in your car, will prevent getting lost, and your car is a safe shelter.
- Don't tire yourself out. Shovelling in the intense cold can be life-threatening.
- Let fresh air in by opening a window on the side sheltered from the wind.
- Keep the engine off as much as possible. Make sure the exhaust pipe is not obstructed by snow.
- Turn on hazard lights or set up road flares to make your car visible.
- Keep moving your hands, feet and arms to maintain circulation, and stay awake.
- Try to keep clothing dry since wet clothing can lead to a dangerous loss of body heat.

PACK A VEHICLE EMERGENCY KIT WITH:

• Flashlight (preferably crank-type, because batteries don't last long in extreme cold)

- Reflective safety triangles or flares
- Small first-aid kit
- Snow brush and scraper
- Tire traction aids
- Small shovel with long handle
- Bag of abrasive material like sand or kitty litter for traction
- Plenty of windshield washer fluid
- Booster cables
- Gas-line antifreeze
- Lock de-icer (in extreme cold, keep it with you, rather than in your vehicle)
- Paper towels
- Small tool kit (Multi-screwdriver, pliers, wrenches, etc.)
- Extra fuses (for the vehicle's electrical system)
- Warm blanket, extra socks, boots and gloves
- Hand and foot warmers
- Bottles of water

 \cdots As we settle into 2024, it's time to reflect on APPY 2023. It wasn't a year without it's challenges, NEW YEAR however, it was a great

year for progress in our municipality.

We were able to wrap up the flood remediation work on a total of 265 sites. This involved rebuilding roadways and ditches, replacing culverts, and learning new ways to keep our municipality safe when water threatens our communities.

We applied fresh gravel to 193 miles of roads, which is 24% of our 800 miles of municipal roadways, with our gravel program.

Our dust control program was a success having applied calcium to 51 sections of roadway. This not only limits dust, it also strengthens the road structure, by providing resistance to erosion from water.

We look forward to an even more productive 2024 as we work to build and maintain a municipality that we can all be proud to call home. We wish you all a safe, happy, peaceful and prosperous new year.

WE'VE GOT YOUR BACK!



If you live in the LUD of Fisher Branch, you probably already have

one of our new water meters. These new meters allow us to take water utility meter readings remotely. This means we no longer need to enter your home to read your meter.

Your water billing is sent out quarterly, however we take readings monthly. This allows us to watch for monthly spikes in water usage. When a substanial spike is noticed we notify the customer there may be a leak. This has already saved our water utility customers many thousands of dollars.

PAYMENTS MADE EASY



With today's technology things like paying your bills online have made things a lot easier.

However, it is still very important to pay attention to details. When setting up online or telephone banking, please be careful where you are sending your money. The Rural Municipality of Fisher will show up as two separate accounts. One will be RM of Fisher: Taxes and the other will be RM of Fisher: Utilities. When you choose one or the other, you are instructing the RM to direct a payment to a specific account and that is where it will go.

In some situations, account holders are only setting up one of the two accounts and assuming the RM will know where to apply their payment. This is not the case. Your funds will be deposited into the account as indicated by the account holder. This can result in credits in the wrong account and past due penalties in the other, because the payment was not made to the correct account.

In other cases, the wrong account is selected in error, and the funds are applied appropriately. This also can result in credits in the wrong account and past due penalties in the other, because the payment was not made to the correct account. The onus is on the account holder to direct funds to the appropriate municipal account. The RM of Fisher will not reverse penalties or assume the responsibility of determining the correct destination of your funds. Please be careful when making your online or telephone banking choices. This will help avoid costly penalties and frustration.
